Our Island communities are realizing that data gathered through the voluntary survey is not as accurate and complete as it was under the mandatory census.

I would like to personally thank the staff of our Statistics Bureau for their hard work and diligence in gathering the information for this year's document. 

Prince Edward Island

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A Historical Note

Before the European explorations, Prince Edward Island was frequently used by the Mi'kmaq People for fishing, hunting and some planting. The Mi'kmaq called the island Epekwitk, meaning "cradle on the waves." Europeans later changed the pronunciation of the name to Abegweit. Historians credit the European discovery of the Island to Jacques Cartier, the French navigator, who claimed the Island for Francis I, King of France, on July 1, 1534. In 1720 the Island, then called Île Saint Jean, was colonized by 300 French settlers, sponsored by a commercial company of the Comte de Saint Pierre. The Island was ceded to Great Britain in 1763. Two years later the designated capital city of the Island of St. John took on the name Charlotte Town in honour of Queen Charlotte, wife of King George III of England. In 1799 the colony was renamed Prince Edward Island in honour of Edward, Duke of Kent, who was then commander of the British forces in North America. Prince Edward Island is known as the "Cradle of Confederation", because the Charlottetown Conference, held there in 1864, initiated the movement toward Canada's federation. The Island became a province in 1873.

The Armorial Bearings of the Province of Prince Edward Island, shown above, were proclaimed to come into force on December 13, 2002. The centrepiece is the Shield of Arms, granted by King Edward VII in 1905, featuring the English heraldic lion, a large oak tree on the right and three young saplings on the left. The mature tree originally represented England, while the three saplings stand for the three counties - Kings, Queens and Prince. Scrolled along the bottom of the Shield of Arms are the Latin words Parva Sub Ingenti, which, when translated, read: The small under the protection of the great. The surrounding elements of the Armorial Bearings illustrate significant characteristics of the province, its position in the Canadian federation, its founding peoples and its natural resources.

PROVINCIAL FLAG

The design of the Prince Edward Island Flag is modelled after the Coat of Arms in rectangular shape and is bordered on the three sides away from the mast by alternate bands of red and white. The official flag was established March 24, 1964.



Samuel Holland's Survey of the Island of St. John

Captain Samuel J. Holland surveyed and mapped Prince Edward Island, then known as the Island of St. John, between 1764 and 1766. During the survey, Holland used innovative instruments such as the astronomical clock and the refracting telescope. His work was so accurate that many of the boundaries for lots and parishes he mapped are still used today. (Image: National Library and Archives Canada).

Economic Review 2014

Overview

GDP by industry for Prince Edward Island expanded by 1.3 per cent in 2014. Leading growth sectors in the province were (in 2007 chained prices): manufacturing (up by \$38.2 million or 9.1 per cent), real estate and rental and leasing (up by \$11.7 million or 1.8 per cent), agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting (up by \$10.9 million or 3.8 per cent), accommodation and food services (up by \$6.6 million or 4.8 per cent) and retail trade (up by \$6.2 million or 2.0 per cent). Sectors showing the largest declines were construction (down by \$16.4 million or 6.0 per cent), public administration (down by \$11.4 million or 1.8 per cent), management of companies and enterprises (down by \$2.2 million or 8.6 per cent) and information and culture (down by \$1.8 million or 1.3 per cent).

GDP Income and Expenditure tables for 2014 are expected to be released by Statistics Canada in the fall of 2015. Statistics Canada estimates that real GDP growth for PEI in 2013 was 2.0 per cent, on par with national growth for 2013. Growth between 2012 and 2013 was largely the result of a 4.5 per cent increase in exports. Final domestic demand increased 1.8 per cent, while household consumption expenditures increased 1.6 per cent. Government gross fixed capital formation increased by 3.7 per cent. Imports increased by 1.8 per cent. Real gross domestic product growth was revised up for 2011 to 1.6 per cent and revised down for 2012 to 1.0 per cent.

The change in the All-Items Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Prince Edward Island was 1.6 per cent in 2014. Leading factors contributing to this were higher prices for energy (up by 2.3 per cent), food (up by 1.4 per cent), and shelter (up by 1.7 per cent). In Canada, prices increased by 2.0 per cent in 2014.


Employment on Prince Edward Island declined by 0.1 per cent in 2014 to average 74,000 for the year. Total labour income increased by 1.7 per cent. The unemployment rate averaged 10.6 per cent in 2014, down 1.0 percentage point from 2013. According to the Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours, employment on Prince Edward Island declined by 0.3 per cent in 2014.

Manufacturing shipments on Prince Edward Island increased by 10.4 per cent to \$1,608 million in 2014, up from \$1,456 in 2013. According to Industry Canada, the value of P.E.I.'s international exports of goods rose by 22.2 per cent in 2014 to reach \$1.1 billion, the first time annual exports have reached \$1 billion. This follows a 5.4 per cent increase in 2013.

The Canadian Economy

Statistics Canada estimates that the Canadian economy expanded by 2.5 per cent in 2014. This compares to a 2.0 per cent increase in 2013 and a 1.9 per cent increase in 2012. Diagram 1 shows quarterly real GDP growth between 2011 and 2014.


Following one quarter of zero growth in the second quarter of 2011, the Canadian economy has seen 14 consecutive quarters



of growth. Through 2014, growth has been supported by all major industries except primary industries. Goods production grew 2.5 per cent in 2014 led by mining and oil and gas extraction, and manufacturing. The service sector grew 2.3 per cent in 2014, led by real estate, rental and leasing, wholesale trade, finance and insurance, retail trade, and transportation and warehousing.

The consumer price index increased 2.0 per cent in 2014 with increases seen across all components. Notable gains were in energy, up 3.6 per cent, shelter, up 0.8 per cent, food, up 2.3 per cent, and transportation, up 1.1 per cent. Core inflation was 1.5 per cent in 2014.


Employment increased slightly by 0.6 per cent to total 17.8 million. Gains were recorded in the services sector, up 0.9 per cent, while employment fell by 0.3 per cent in the goods sector. Notable employment gains were seen in accommodation and food services, up 3.2 per cent, health care and social assistance, up 1.4 per cent, professional, scientific and technical services, up 1.7 per cent, and trade, up 0.7 per cent. Notable declines occurred in manufacturing, down 0.7 per cent, agriculture, down 2.8 per cent and public administration, down 0.9 per cent. The unemployment rate averaged 6.9 per cent in 2014, a decline of 0.2 percentage points from 2013. Diagram 2 shows percent employment change in Canada by sector.



The American Economy


After growing by 2.2 per cent in 2013, real GDP in the U.S. increased 2.4 per cent in 2014. The acceleration in growth was largely caused by accelerated nonresidential fixed investment, a smaller decrease in federal government spending, and accelerations in personal consumption expenditures and state and local government spending. Imports also increased over this period, which are a subtraction in the calculation of GDP. The U.S. also saw a deceleration of residential fixed investment in 2014.

The employment situation in the United States continues to improve. After expanding by 1.0 per cent in 2013, average non-farm payroll employment grew by 1.6 per cent in 2014, or 2.4 million jobs. The increase in 2014 returns the U.S. employment level to that of its pre-recession peak in 2007.



After peaking in 2010 at 9.6 per cent, the average annual unemployment rate continues to trend downward in the United States, finishing 2014 with an average of 6.2 per cent, as shown in diagram 3. Unemployment has been under 8.0 per cent since January of 2013, and finished 2014 at 5.6 per cent in December. This is still slightly higher than levels seen in the years prior to the recession. The annual average of unemployed persons in 2014 was 9.6 million. Of those people, the long term unemployed, those who have been out of work for more than 27 weeks, account for 3.2 million or 33.3 per cent of the total unemployed.

The Prince Edward Island Economy




Gross Domestic Product

Statistics Canada preliminary estimates of GDP by Industry indicate that the Prince Edward Island economy expanded by 1.3 per cent in chained 2007 dollars in 2014, following 2.2 per cent growth in 2013 and 1.1 per cent growth in 2012. Diagram 4 shows growth in provincial Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Industry since 2005. For more information about GDP see Tables 37 to 43³.

Consumer Prices

The All-Items Consumer Price Index for Prince Edward Island increased by 1.6 per cent in 2014, compared to a rise of 2.0 per cent nationally. Core inflation, the year-over-year rate of change of the CPI excluding food, energy and the effects of changes in indirect taxes, also rose by 1.6 per cent in 2014. Food prices increased by 1.4 per cent over 2013, while shelter prices increased by 1.7 per cent.

Energy prices continued to rise in 2014, up 2.3 per cent as compared to 4.4 per cent in 2013. Diagram 5 shows the annual average price of unleaded gasoline and fuel oil sold on Prince Edward Island between 2007 and 2014. Gasoline prices (regular self-serve) averaged \$1.314 per litre for 2014, the highest ever average annual price for gasoline on PEI. Prices peaked at \$1.394 per litre in May. Prices then declined each month for the remainder of the year, to reach \$1.049 per litre in December. The price of home heating oil averaged \$1.13 per



litre in 2014, ranging from a high of \$1.274 per litre in March to a low \$0.99 per litre in December. For more information on Consumer Prices, see Tables 44 - 47, and for more on fuel and oil prices and national comparisons, see Tables 90 and 91.

Labour Force

The annual average of total employment on Prince Edward Island decreased slightly, by 0.1 per cent from 74,100 in 2013 to 74,000 in 2014. Employment in the goods-producing sector increased by 3.4 per cent in 2014, while employment in the service providing sector fell by 1.1 per cent.





Diagram 6 indicates that a total of 1,400 jobs were created in manufacturing, transportation and warehousing, construction, and other services in 2014. The remaining sectors accounted for a loss of 1,400 jobs⁴. The labour force participation rate decreased from 69.7 per cent in 2013 to 68.7 per cent in 2014. The annual average unemployment rate fell to 10.6 per cent in 2014 from 11.6 per cent in 2013. Statistics Canada's Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours shows that employment on Prince Edward Island decreased by 0.3 per cent in 2014, following a decline of 1.8 per cent in 2013. The largest declines were seen in manufacturing, public administration, and education. Sectors showing the most growth were trade, administrative support, and information and culture. Income

Statistics Canada estimates that labour income for Prince Edward Island rose 1.7 per cent to reach \$2,973 million in 2014. Diagram 7 shows labour income growth from 2005 to 2014. The major contributors to growth in 2014 were in *trade* (up by 7.8 per cent), *professional and personal services* (up by 4.8 per cent), and *health care and social assistance* (up by 2.5 per cent). Population

On July 1, 2014, the population of Prince Edward Island was estimated at 146,283, an increase of 778 persons or 0.5 per cent over 2013. The population of Canada increased by 1.1 per cent over the same period. Preliminary data show that 1,399 immigrants chose Prince Edward Island as their new home in 2013/14 while 47 emigrants left the Island, resulting in a total of 1,364 for net international migration. Net interprovincial migration was -957, with Ontario, Alberta, and New Brunswick being the top destinations of Islanders leaving for other provinces. Between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014 the total number of Island births was an estimated 1,423. The number of deaths was estimated to be 1,306, an increase of 1.7 per cent. Thus population growth by natural increase amounted to 117 during that period.

The aging of the Island population is illustrated by the fact that the median age⁵ has risen from 24.8 years in 1971 to 43.3 years in 2014. Furthermore, while 11.0 per cent of the population was 65 years and older in 1971, this proportion had risen to 17.9 per cent in 2014. The total dependency ratio⁶ has increased from 47.9 to 51.0 in just two years.

According to the 2011 Census of Population count on May 10, 2011 there were 140,204 persons living on Prince Edward Island. Revised population estimates based on the 2011 Census were published by Statistics Canada in the fall of 2014. For more information on population and Census see Tables 1 to 15.



Industrial Profiles

Manufacturing

Diagram 8 shows total manufacturing shipments for Prince Edward Island from 2009 to 2014. Total shipments increased by 10.4 per cent in 2014 to a value of \$1,608 million. This follows increases from 2011 to 2013. Fish product shipments increased by 49.1 per cent over 2013 to value \$230 million. Employment in the manufacturing sector increased by 12.0 per cent in 2014 to reach 5,600.

Exports

According to Industry Canada, the total value of exported goods grew from \$917.9 million in 2013 to \$1.1 billion in 2014, an increase of 22.2 per cent and the first time PEI exports exceeded \$1 billion. Exports of frozen food products made up 19.5 per cent of all international exports of goods in 2014. Its value decreased from \$222.1 million in 2013 to \$218.8 million in 2014, a decrease of 1.5 per cent. Other exports included seafood products valued at \$198.1 million (up by 35.4 per cent from 2013), \$83.2 million in engine and turbine equipment exports (up by 28.0 per cent) and \$73.9 million in aerospace products and parts (up by 13.3 per cent).


Agriculture

Farm cash receipts for 2014 totaled \$488.1 million, a decrease of 0.6 per cent over 2013. This compares to an increase of 4.6 per cent for Canada as a whole. Increases in crop and livestock receipts were offset by a 28.6 per cent decline in direct payments to farmers. Total crop receipts totaled \$320.9 million, an increase of 1.6 per cent over 2013, due mainly to a 4.6 per cent increase in potato receipts. Total livestock receipts grew for the fifth consecutive year, increasing by 0.7 per cent. Cattle receipts increased by 40.6 per cent and hog receipts increased by 5.2 per cent. Dairy and egg receipts declined, falling by 0.2 per cent and 6.5 per cent respectively.

Retail Trade

Retail sales on Prince Edward Island in 2014 increased for the fifth year in a row with a 3.3 per cent increase. Diagram 9 shows retails sales growth since 2005. Sales were valued at \$2,005.2 million. Notable increases were seen in supermarkets, up 7.7 per cent or \$27.7 million, and motor vehicle and parts dealers, up 5.5 per cent or \$22.5 million. Sales were down notably at furniture stores (down 10.2




per cent or \$2.2 million) and at electronics and appliance stores (down 5.1 per cent or \$2.0 million). The number of new vehicles sold saw an increase of 219 vehicles with a total of 7,555 vehicles sold, an all time high for new vehicles sold on PEI. The value of new vehicles sold was \$218.2 million (up 5.6 per cent), also an all time high. Employment in the wholesale/retail trade sector was unchanged in 2014, remaining at 11,000. Employment in this sector remains the largest private sector employer in the province.

Fisheries and Forestry

The Department of Agriculture and Fisheries estimates that the value of total fish landings in 2014 increased by 14.1 per cent to \$175.9 million, a new all time high for fish landings on PEI. Molluscs and crustaceans continue to be the top species of the Island fishery comprising 96.1 per cent of the total value of all fish landings. Total lobster landings increased by 5.1 per cent to reach a record 29.8 million pounds, which was valued at \$113.3 million, slightly below the record value set in 2012. Diagram 10 shows the value of lobster landings on PEI from 2005 to 2014. Following a decline in 2013, lobster prices increased by 26.7 per cent in 2014 to \$3.80/lb. The value of other crustaceans and molluscs increased by 3.0 per cent in 2014.



Landings of groundfish, pelagic and estuarial fish were 24.2 per cent lower than last year, falling to 15.0 million pounds, the fourth straight year of decline. Prices decreased in 2014 for hake (down by 42.0 per cent to 30.4 cents/lb.), herring (down by 20.2 per cent to 16.6 cents/lb.), smelts (down by 57.8 per cent to 32.0 cents/lb.), and irish moss (down by 11.0 per cent to 13.0 cents/lb.). Higher prices were seen for cod (up by 1.2 per cent to 96.5 cents/lb.), mackerel (up by 46.5 per cent to 50.1 cents/lb.) snow crab (up by 28.7 per cent to \$2.90/lb.), rock crab (up by 10.3 per cent to 53.7 cents/lb.), and oysters (up by 12.5 per cent to \$1.35/lb.). The P.E.I. Department of Environment, Energy and Forestry estimates that the total volume of wood harvested on Prince Edward Island has declined from 442,000 cubic metres in 2012 to 355,000 cubic metres in 2013, a decrease of 19.7 per cent. Industrial wood production declined by 27.4 per cent in 2013, while the consumption of fuel wood and fuel chips decreased by 21.2 per cent.

Tourism

The number of overnight stays increased by 5.9 per cent, while occupancy rates at Island accommodations increased by 1.2 percentage points. Campgrounds continued to do well in 2014, with sight nights sold up 8.4 per cent and the occupancy rate up 1.4 percentage points.

The total number of passengers travelling through Charlottetown Airport increased in 2014, rising from 296,301 in 2013 to 317,827 or 7.3 per cent. 157,719 passengers flew into Prince Edward Island (up 7.4 per cent), while 160,108 people left the province by air (up by 7.1 per cent).

Ferry traffic⁸ fell by 3.7 per cent. Annual bridge traffic was up slightly by 0.7 per cent and cruise ship passengers to the Island decreased by 8.5 per cent in 2014.

Construction and Investment

Statistics Canada estimates that total investment on Prince Edward Island valued \$858.7 million in 2014, a decrease of 11.5 per cent over the previous year. Public sector investment decreased from \$311.2 million in 2013 to \$232.4 million in 2014, a decrease of 25.3 per cent, while private sector investment declined by 4.9 per cent, from \$658.6 million in 2013 to \$626.3 million in 2014.

Non-residential investment increased by 3.2 per cent in 2014, due to a 61.3 per cent decrease in industrial investment. Government and Institutional investment saw a decrease of 11.2 per cent, while commercial investment was down 0.7 per cent.

Residential investment decreased 8.2 per cent in 2014, largely due to decreased investment in multi-unit buildings, which declined by 52.1 per cent. Investment in renovations increased by 7.8 per cent.



The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) estimated that there were 511 new housing starts on Prince Edward Island in 2014, a decline of 19.7 per cent. As seen in Diagram 11, apartments and row housing decreased from 283 starts in 2013 to 167 in 2014. The number of semi-detached and

duplex starts also decreased, from 71 in 2013 to 52 in 2014. Single dwelling housing starts increased slightly in 2014, going from 282 in 2013 to 292 in 2014, an increase of 3.5 per cent. Despite the increase, single dwelling housing starts remain at levels which are less than half that seen in the early 2000's.

The Public Service Sector

Statistics Canada's Survey of Employment, Earnings and Hours (SEPH) indicates that employment in public administration (federal, provincial and municipal) decreased by 3.4 per cent in 2014. Employment in the health and social services sector increased by 1.3 per cent, while employment in the education sector decreased by 3.8 per cent.

Provincial Finance

The provincial Public Accounts, Consolidated Statement of Operations for fiscal year 2013/14 shows that the Province of Prince Edward Island received \$1,691.8 million in total revenue, 5.9 per cent higher than in FY 2012/13. Provincial own-source revenues were valued at \$1,031.9 million that year, an increase of 4.2 per cent from a year earlier. Total federal transfers to Prince Edward Island contributed 38.5 per cent to the province's total revenue in FY 2013/14 compared to 37.3 per cent in the last fiscal year. Equalization payments increased by 0.7 per cent to value \$339.5 million, while Canada Health and Social Transfer (CHST) payments advanced 5.5 per cent to total \$179.9 million that fiscal year. Total expenditures rose by 3.7 per cent to reach \$1,738 million.

The Consolidated Statement of Operations also shows a deficit for FY 2013/14 in the amount of \$45.9 million. As of March 31, 2014 the provincial net debt was \$2,099 million, up 2.9 per cent from 2013. More data on the government sector can be found at Tables 110 to 114.









Results of the Canadian Income Survey should not be compared to those produced by the Survey of Labour and Income Dynamics or other previous income surveys.

Before-tax low income cut-offs (1992 base) were determined from an analysis of the 1992 Family Expenditure Survey data. These income limits were selected on the basis that families with incomes below these limits usually spent 54.7% or more of their income on food, shelter and clothing. Low income cut-offs were differentiated by community size of residence and family size.

The Market Basket Measure (MBM) attempts to measure a standard of living that is a compromise between subsistence and social inclusion. It also reflects differences in living costs across regions. The MBM represents the cost of a basket that includes: a nutritious diet, clothing and footwear, shelter, transportation, and other necessary goods and services (such as personal care items or household supplies). The cost of the basket is compared to disposable income for each family to determine low income rates.

Low income measures (LIMs), are relative measures of low income, set at 50% of adjusted median household income. These measures are categorized according to the number of persons present in the household, reflecting the economies of scale inherent in household size.



PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND FISHING DISTRICTS


